Discussion Questions

- 1. Isolation and Loneliness
- What factors do you think have contributed most to the epidemic of loneliness in our culture today?

2. Personal Reflection

- A recent study showed that over the past 50 years, people increasingly feel isolated, invisible, and insignificant.
- Do any of those three words resonate with you personally right now?
- If so, which one—and why?

3. Scripture Insight

- Read John 15:12-13 together.
- What stands out to you from Jesus' words in this passage?
- Does someone come to mind when you think of a "lay down your life" kind of friend? Why?

4. Imago Dei (Image of God)

- Since we are created in the image of a relational God (Father, Son, Holy Spirit), how does that truth shape the way you think about building friendships?
- Where do you see yourself resisting vulnerability even though you know you were made for community?

5. Taking Initiative

- Would you say you are intentional about cultivating meaningful friendships? Why or why
- What is one step you could take this week to grow one of your friendships (or start a new one)?
